60 Credits Introducing the Great Kiwi Entrepreneur

PROGRAMME LENGTH: 18 Weeks (plus holiday breaks)
CLASS TIMES: 20 hours per week,

This course focuses on the development, operation and management of small businesses. The NZ Certificate in Business Level 3 is designed for people with little to no business experience and it provides them with the knowledge and skills to prepare them to establish and manage their own business or further study. Within the course modules, students will learn to work in a team, conduct financial planning and use a range of Microsoft Office products. Soft skills such as professional, ethical and cultural behaviour, problem-solving, decision-making skills and self-management techniques with also be taught.

The course helps students to gain knowledge of marketing concepts.

This programme is designed for those who want to stan a career in the health and wellbeing industry. It teaches transferable skills and knowledge that are highly valued across the sector

The purpose of this programme is to recognise the skills and knowledge required to provide person-centred support in the health and wellbeing sectors. It will also equip students with professional attitude, skills and hands-on experience which would enable them to contribute to enhancing the health and wellbeing of an individual in a home or an organisation. Graduates of the programme will possess the skills and knowledge valued across the sector and will be capable of working in a range of roles under limited supervision. The course includes 150 hours of work placement in a support

Café and Bar strands PROGRAMME LENGTH: 20 Weeks CLASS TIMES: 20 hours per week,

This course will give students the skills to 'hit the ground running'. Students will learn practical skills such as making coffee and cocktails, gain knowledge about food safety, wine and beer (with an emphasis on New Zealand wines). The course also covers health and safety legislation and the License Controller Qualification (LCQ). Class trips to restaurants, hotels and food festivals to see new trends in the industry are included. This programme is designed for people looking to enter the hospitality industry with no prior knowledge or experience.

This course builds upon existing skills and knowledge in hospitality and helps students to 'think like a manager'. People are at the heart of the hospitality industry, and students will learn not only how to manage staff, but also how to provide amazing experiences for their guests. Students will learn the legal and financial framework that governs the industry, and how to adapt their business as the market changes. Assessment is through written case studies, industry research, presentations and Q&A sessions with the tutor. In addition, students will complete a 60-hour Real World Experience internship along with gaining their License Controller Qualification (LCQ). Hotel and restaurant visits are conducted throughout the programme to see theory put into practice.

INTERNSHIP AND REAL WORK EXPERIENCE

Internship or "Real World Experience" (RWE) is a core component of all our courses.

They play a crucial role in equipping students with the skills and experiences required to find a job and excel in it.

Crown works with numerous local businesses, multinational corporations, tourism operators, travel agencies, hotels, restaurants and health organisations to ensure students are placed into positions that suit their character and needs. Organisations we work with have great staff development and advancement opportunities, many of our students continue to be employed by them upon completion of their studies.

STUDY & WORK PROGRAMME

This is an optional service available to students currently studying at Crown. Study & Work has been designed with the help of employers, recruitment agents, schoolteachers, and careers advisors to prepare you for work. You will learn the skills needed by the hiring companies upon graduating from the programme whilst gaining invaluable practical experience as well as earning money during your studies.

The programme includes:

- Free professional training in employment skills and customer service from Function Staff, our Study and Work partners.
- Paid casual / part-time employment with Function Staff during your course.
- Free 1-1 CV preparation, career advice and interview skills with Crown's career service team.
- A standard reference will be included at the end of your program upon request.

JOB SEARCH FAIR

Crown in partnership with Worldwide School of English runs a Job Search Fair every 9 weeks at Crown Institute main campus.

The event brings together different companies that are looking for staff, providing the students with an opportunity to use the CV and the job skills built during the CV class. Many students sign up for jobs on the spot and get the chance to secure a real job apply term and conditions.

*All students must go through the hiring process for each company they sign up with. Crown Institute does not guarantee any job as this is a private hiring process that varies from company to company.

CROWN SMALL BUSINESS ENTREPRENEUR SCHEME

The Small Business Entrepreneur Scheme offers selected students a platform to outwork their entrepreneurial knowledge.

A seed fund* and comprehensive mentoring will help materialise the business opportunity.

ELIGIBILITY

Graduates of New Zealand Certificate in Business Level 4 can apply for the Scheme within six months of course completion. A maximum of two business plans per calendar year will be funded.

SCHEME DETAILS

Aspiring students will submit a business plan to the scheme's committee for consideration. Selected students will have four weeks to complete their business plan. Consultation sessions and one-on-one mentoring will be provided. The Business Plan must be feasible, detailed and comprehensive.

*The Seed Fund is an investment in a Kiwi Entrepreneur's business. As an investor and shareholder Crown will receive dividends for a determined period and under defined conditions.

A maximum \$20,000 will be invested. The total investment will not exceed 20% of total shares of the Entrepreneur's business.

After the first 12 months, if the business is profitable, Crown will start to receive its share of dividends from the business, which is a maximum 20% of profits.

Crown is eligible to receive up to 150% of the invested seed fund. After this threshold is reached, Crown will cease to receive any further share dividends from the business, and will no longer be considered a shareholder of the business.

If the business is not making a profit or closes down, the Entrepreneur will not be held to any obligation to return the seed fun.

While Crown's intention is not to profit from the Scheme, it is important that the Seed Funded business be self-sustaining.

Domestic and international students graduating from Crown's New Zealand Certificate in Business (Level 4) will be eligible for direct entry into year 1 of the following programmes from Massey University.

Upon fulfilling the entry requirements for Crown's NZCBL4 and successfully completing it, students are considered to have met both the academic and English requirement of the above mentioned Bachelor programmes, no further English tests are required.

OVERSEAS STUDY PATHWAY


